WHEREAS, within six years Black History Month was being celebrated in educational institutions and community centers all over the country; and

WHEREAS, President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month during the celebration of the United States Bicentennial in 1976 urging his fellow Americans to “seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history;” and

WHEREAS, the month-long celebration, now known as African American History Month, has been officially recognized at the Federal, State and Local levels of government; and

WHEREAS, the contributions of African Americans from all walks of life and their endeavors to learn, thrive and contribute throughout history makes it imperative that we recognize the unforgettable marks made by African American artists, scientists, educators, business people, influential thinkers, members of the faith community, athletes, and political and governmental leaders who have contributed so much to the greatness of America;

WHEREAS, five (5) responsive EOIs were received and evaluated by a Selection Committee comprised of the Town Supervisor, Commissioner of Public Works, and Director of Planning and Zoning, which recommended section of the firm CHA, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the selected consultant CHA, Inc., has provided a scope and fee in the amount of \$169,777 to provide Preliminary Design, Final Design, and Right-of-Way Incidentals, and Right-of-Way Acquisition services in connection with the Project, which has been reviewed and approved by the Selection Committee members; and

WHEREAS, the Town Comptroller has confirmed that this resolution will have a material impact on the Town’s finances; and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Greenbush desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of Preliminary Design, Final Design, and Right-of-Way Acquisition services;

now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby approves the above-subject Project;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Town of East Greenbush to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of Preliminary Design, Final Design, and Right-of-Way Acquisition work for the Project or portions thereof;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$169,777.00 is hereby appropriated pursuant to the Town of East Greenbush 2019 Town Budget and made available to cover the cost of participation in the Preliminary Design, Final Design, and Right-of-Way Incidentals, and Right-of-Way Acquisition phases of the Project, of which sum \$135,822.00 is the Federal reimbursement share and \$33,955.00 is the local share;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event that the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Town Board of the Town of East Greenbush shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon notification by NYSDOT thereof;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor be and hereby is authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the Town of East Greenbush with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of Federal-aid and state aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.
