209-2024 A Resolution Recognizing September as “CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH” and September 27, 2024 as “East Greenbush Goes Gold Day”

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society reports that cancer is the leading cause of death by disease among children in the United States between infancy and age 15, and estimates that more than 10,000 children will be diagnosed with cancer each year; and

WHEREAS, although progress has been made in combating pediatric cancer, approximately 1,050 children younger than 15 years old will lose their battle with cancer; and many infants, children and teens will suffer from long-term side effects of comprehensive treatment, including secondary cancers; and

WHEREAS, there is significant progress that still must be made with regard to childhood cancer treatment; progress towards an effective treatment is painfully slow with dramatically fewer new FDA approved treatments for childhood cancer approved each year than for cancer in adults; and

WHEREAS, the designation of September as “Childhood Cancer Awareness Month” could increase the rate of early detection, lead to newer and improved treatments, and an overall higher survival rate for children diagnosed with the condition; and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Greenbush wishes to support the fight against childhood cancer in any way possible so that we may give any child afflicted with cancer the best chance possible; and

WHEREAS, “East Greenbush Goes Gold” is an initiative intended to raise awareness of the issue of childhood cancers, and this Board would like to support such a campaign to help raise awareness in honor of young patients, their loved ones, and all those who support them; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that September 2024 is designated "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in the Town of East Greenbush to promote awareness of pediatric cancer and to support the brave children who battle cancer every day;

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates that approximately 297,790 women received a diagnosis of breast cancer in 2023, making this disease the most frequently diagnosed cancer among women other than skin cancers; and

WHEREAS, the 2.3 million breast cancer survivors living in the United States today are a testament to courage, as well as to the importance of promoting awareness about breast cancer, providing information, funding research, following recommended screening guidelines, and offering treatment to those who are affected; and

WHEREAS, through research and advocacy, significant advances have been made in the fight against breast cancer; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of various organizations have made a major contribution to spreading breast cancer awareness to both women and men through outreach, education, and screening programs, and have empowered women with the lifesaving message of early detection and the importance of having annual mammograms; and

WHEREAS, domestic intimate partner violence is violence or aggression that occurs in a close relationship including current and former spouses and dating partners; and

WHEREAS, data from the CDC’s National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey indicate approximately 1 in 3 women and nearly 1 in 4 men have experienced contact sexual violence, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner during their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, many of the 10 million women and 5 million men who reported experiencing this violence also indicated that they first experienced these or other forms of violence by that partner before the age of 18; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence takes many forms, including physical violence, sexual assault, economic control, psychological/emotional abuse, or a combination of more than one of these and violence and can vary in frequency and severity and occurs on a continuum, ranging from one episode to chronic and severe episodes over a period of years; and

WHEREAS, the Town of East Greenbush wishes to support Domestic Violence Awareness Month by raising awareness of the prevalence and dangers of domestic violence between intimate partners;

now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that to shine light on the subject of domestic violence and potentially reduce the number of acts each year the Town Board recognizes October to be Domestic Violence Awareness Month;

215-2024 A Resolution to Schedule a Public Hearing for the CM Designs Major Site Plan (PZD#: 24-17)

WHEREAS, Advanced Engineering & Surveying, PLLC on behalf of CM Designs and Construction, LLC has submitted a Major Site Plan application for a project consisting of the construction of one (1) 10,000sf Warehouse building and one (1) 12,553sf Warehouse building and related site improvements known as “CM Designs Major Site Plan” located at 589 3rd Ave Ext, Rensselaer, NY 12144 and identified on the Town’s Tax Roll as Tax Parcel No. 144.-4-11 (the “Project”); and

216-2024 A Resolution Authorizing the Solicitation of Engineering Services Via a Mini-Bid for the Development of a Stormwater Management Program Update

WHEREAS, the Town of East Greenbush is a regulated municipal separate stormwater sewer system (MS4) community under the United States Environmental Protection Agency’s Phase II Stormwater Rule; and

WHEREAS, as a designated MS4 Operator, the Town of East Greenbush is required to develop a stormwater management program (SWMP) to reduce the discharge of pollutants to the maximum extent practicable with the intent to improve water quality and recreational use of waterways; and

WHEREAS, the Town’s current stormwater management program was prepared with the assistance of a professional engineering firm in September of 2018 and last revised in November of 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Town’s current stormwater management program was developed in compliance with the regulatory requirements set forth by New York State Department of Environmental Conservation’s (NYSDEC) Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) General Permit GP-0-15-003; and

WHEREAS, NYSDEC has introduced new regulations for MS4 Operators, set forth by NYSDEC SPDES MS4 GP-0-24-001; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Director of Planning and Zoning that the Town’s current stormwater management program should be reviewed in accordance with MS4 GP-0-24-001 and subsequently updated to comply with the requirements set forth in MS4 GP-0-24-001; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance confirms that the issuance of a solicitation seeking professional services will not have a material impact on the Town’s finances;
now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Director of Planning and Zoning to solicit proposals to carry out a comprehensive review of the Town’s stormwater management program and provide assistance with conducting an update to the existing stormwater management program in compliance with GP-0-24-001 utilizing the approved list of Town Designated Engineers via a “mini-bid” process among the engineering firms already vetted for selection by the Town.

217-2024 A Resolution Requesting that the New York State Department of Transportation’s Region One Office Commit to the Inclusion of Sidewalk Reconstruction Along the Southwesterly Side of Columbia Turnpike, Between its Intersection with Hays Road and with Sussex Road, as Part of its Five-Year Capital Plan

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation (hereinafter, the “DOT”) has heretofore provided for continuous sidewalk construction and reconstruction along Columbia Turnpike (albeit, not necessarily on both sides thereof), between its intersection with Hays Road at the northwesterly corner and with the town of East Greenbush/city of Rensselaer municipal line; and

WHEREAS, such sidewalk construction/reconstruction by the DOT has been completed in conjunction with *both* full-grade and partial-grade reconstruction of the afore-described section of Columbia Turnpike over the preceding 22 years, the most recent portion of such sidewalk construction/reconstruction having occurred, between its intersection with Hays Road at the northwesterly corner and with Gilligan Road at its southwesterly corner, in conjunction with such partial-grade reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, inasmuch as the afore-referenced, recently completed partial-grade reconstruction of Columbia Turnpike, between its intersection with Hays Road at the southwesterly corner and with Sussex Road at the northwesterly corner, did not include sidewalk construction/reconstruction along the southwesterly side of such section (hereinafter, “Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction”), the Town’s Director of Planning and Zoning, who acknowledges the Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction as a significant enhancement to the Town’s Complete Streets Program, and the Commissioner of Public Works, who has deemed the Town’s prospective assumption of maintenance responsibility over the Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction to be reasonable and appropriate, have recommended that the DOT undertake the Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, the regional director of the DOT’s Region One Office, Michael G. Arthur, P.E., via discussion with a member of the Town Council, has indicated his willingness to review

the feasibility in programming the Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction as part of the Region’s Five-Year Capital Program and, if deemed to be feasible, include it as a part thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance confirms that the proposed resolution poses no unmanageable, material impact to the Town’s finances;
now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Proposed Sidewalk Construction/Reconstruction, as recommended hereinabove, is hereby enacted as official policy of this Town Board;

WHEREAS, the Town of East Greenbush has experienced several water breaks throughout Town on recently resurfaced roads that has compromised a larger section of road; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Works has received quotes from Valley Paving, an approved contractor on the Rensselaer County Contract for paving for the repair of Justine Court (repaved 2021), Point View Drive (repaved 2023) and Sherwood Ave; and

WHEREAS, repairing the sections of road that were compromised during the recent water breaks will restore the paved surface and maintain the longevity of the road; and

WHEREAS, the quotes received are as follows:
