**WHEREAS**, the SEC encourages issuers of Offerings to adopt post-issuance compliance policies to ensure compliance with Continuing Disclosure Agreements and the Rule; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town desires to adopt written post-issuance compliance policies to ensure that the Town is in compliance with its obligations under the Code and the Rule; and

**WHEREAS**, members of the Town Board have had an opportunity to review a copy of the Post-Issuance Compliance Policy for Tax-Exempt and Tax-Advantaged Bonds and Continuing Disclosure (the “Policy”); and
