Date	Public Open House/Visioning Workshop
	The first public engagement event took place on June 17,
	2019 from 6:00-8:00pm at the Red Barn at the East
	Greenbush Town Park. Over 100 community members
	attended the event which included an open house with
	opening remarks from Jack Conway, Town Supervisor and a
	presentation by Jackie Hakes (MJ) who provided an
	overview of the project and engagement event activities.
	The purpose of the workshop was to introduce the project
	to the public and to gather input about a variety of topic
	areas and the community's vision for the future of East
	·
	Greenbush. Input was collected at a number of activity
	stations where attendees could leave comments on post-it notes or comment cards.
	The open house included a variety of activity stations that
	included background information about the project,
	existing conditions in the Town and topic-based stations to

gather input about opportunities and challenges in the Town. The activity stations included:

Mr. Gillcrist (MJ) then provided an overview of survey highlights to date and an overview of common themes received through the feedback at the Public Open House and Workshop on June 17, 2019.

Next, Ms. Hakes led a discussion and interactive exercise about developing a vision and goals for the Comprehensive Plan. This included what a vision is and examples of vision statements from other communities.

#### What is a Vision?

- A vision statement establishes the direction of the community over the next five to ten years
- It forms the basis for the comprehensive plan
- All subsequent recommendations aim to achieve the established vision
- Typically uses present tense (as if you are 10 years in the future)
- Subjects typically addressed:
  - Common values of a community
  - Qualities or resources that make a community unique or describe its identity
  - Attributes people like and want to be sure to keep or want to change about their community
  - Preferred future for each subject area of the community

#### Discussion of Draft Vision and Goals

#### Interactive exercise

Next, Ms. Hakes led a discussion with the committee to begin developing ideas for a vision for the Town over the next 5, 10 or 20 years. The committee was asked to share ideas about what the community should be in the future by completing the sentence, "The Town of East Greenbush is..." Following is a summary of comments received:

- A great place to raise a family
- A great place to live
- Has something for everybody
- Is largest town in county
- Has good schools
- A healthy sustainable community starting with good schools
- A small town in a modern suburb
- A safe community
- A community supportive of local businesses
  - Atmosphere to support
  - o Resident's support
- Easy traffic flow (address traffic)
- Offers quality affordable housing/workforce housing
- A connected community that is organized and unified
- Attractive to others (sporting events)
  - A destination/attraction for learning and sports
- Has a sense of community
- Is a community of hamlets/neighborhoods
- Has spirit and pride
- A community of long-term friendships
  - Personal/social connections
- Trail connections to 9/20 and businesses
- A major player in the region for employment and entertainment
- Has planned growth
- Has connected neighbors
- Has organized development (in right spot)
- 9/20 is the spine
  - o Attractive; facelift; supports commerce
  - Gateway to Town
- Walkable/bikeable supported by land uses

At the next public meeting in the fall, the public will have the opportunity to weigh-in on the draft vision and recommend andy changes or additions.
